



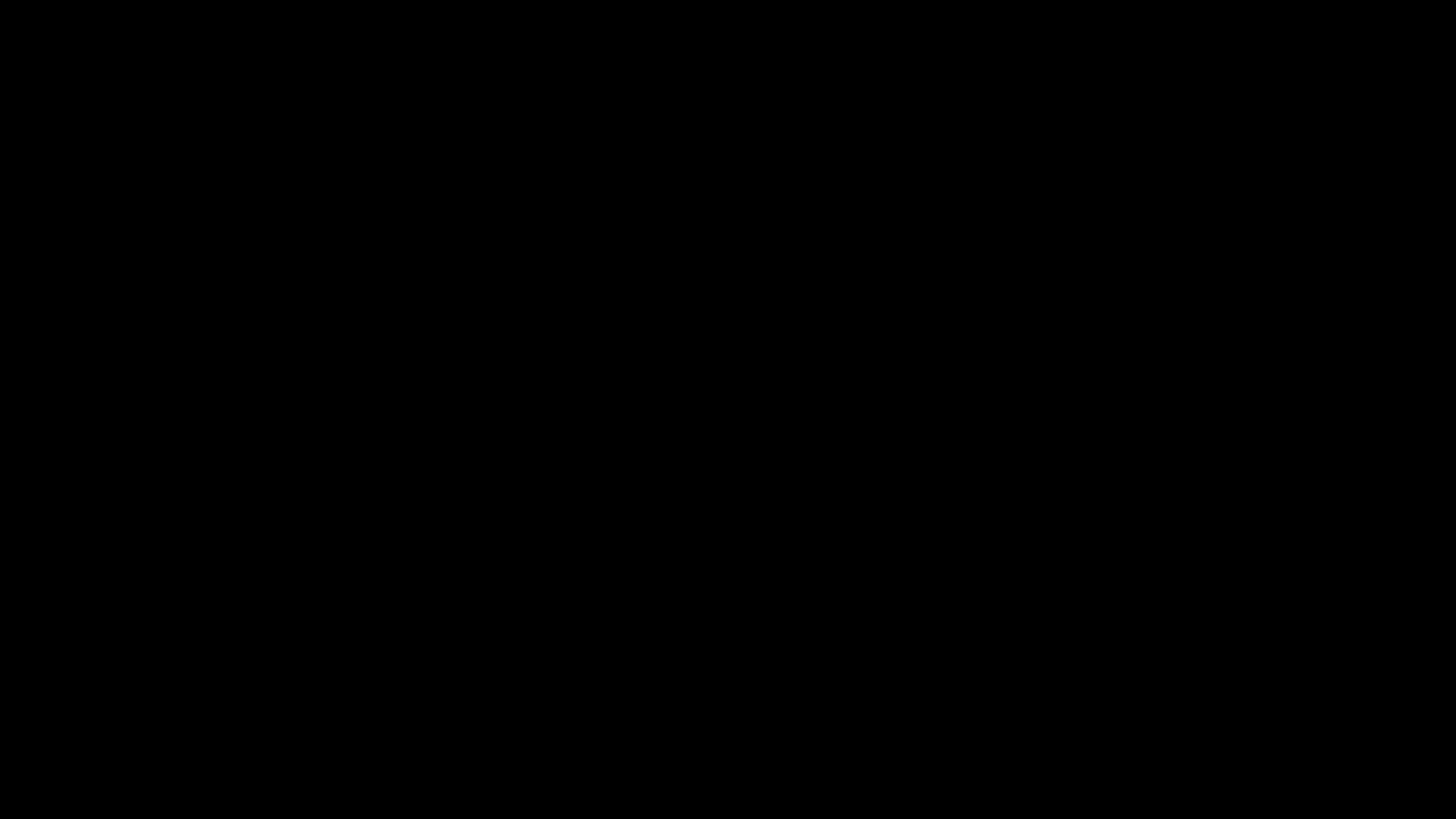

# SDC-SNSF partnership

- Long-term partnership (NCCR North-South 2001-2013, r4d programme 2012-2023)
- Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between SDC and SNSF signed in January 2021.
- SDC and SNSF coordinate their funding efforts for cross-border research partnerships with developing countries, including activities for the dissemination and utilisation of research results in all sectors of society.

# SOR4D programme goal

The overarching goal is to **produce better knowledge, solutions and innovation by needs-driven, transdisciplinary research** that opens up new ways for advancing sustainable development and reducing poverty in the least developed, low and lower middle-income countries.

The SOR4D programme strives to contribute to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda by fostering partnerships, co-creation of knowledge and innovation.

# SOR4D specific objectives

- 1 Researchers and development actors jointly generate **needs-based, solution-oriented knowledge and innovative solutions** that contributes to sustainable development and poverty reduction in the Global South and East.
- 2 Project partnerships and networks test and validate research results with **impact potential** and explore **scaling pathways**. This includes disseminating findings and engaging with stakeholders to reach impact at scale.
- 3 Researchers and non-academic actors **enhance their competences** in conducting solution-oriented **transdisciplinary research** in transformative complex development settings.

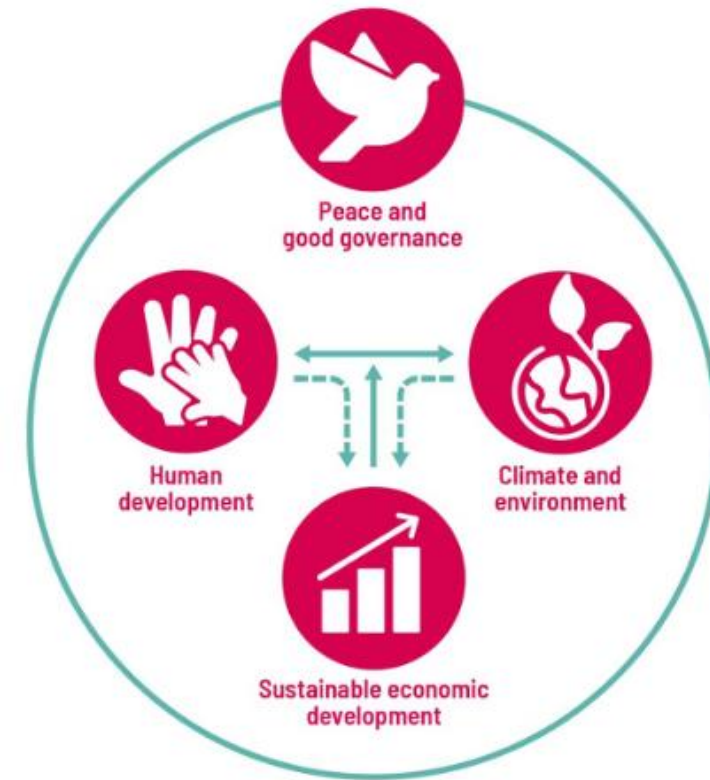
# SOR4D: characteristics of projects

- **open to all disciplines** from the humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, engineering, health and life sciences.
- encourages **interdisciplinary collaboration between research domains** where such collaboration is appropriate
- explicit aim for **systemic and transformative solutions** that simultaneously address several of the 17 SDGs

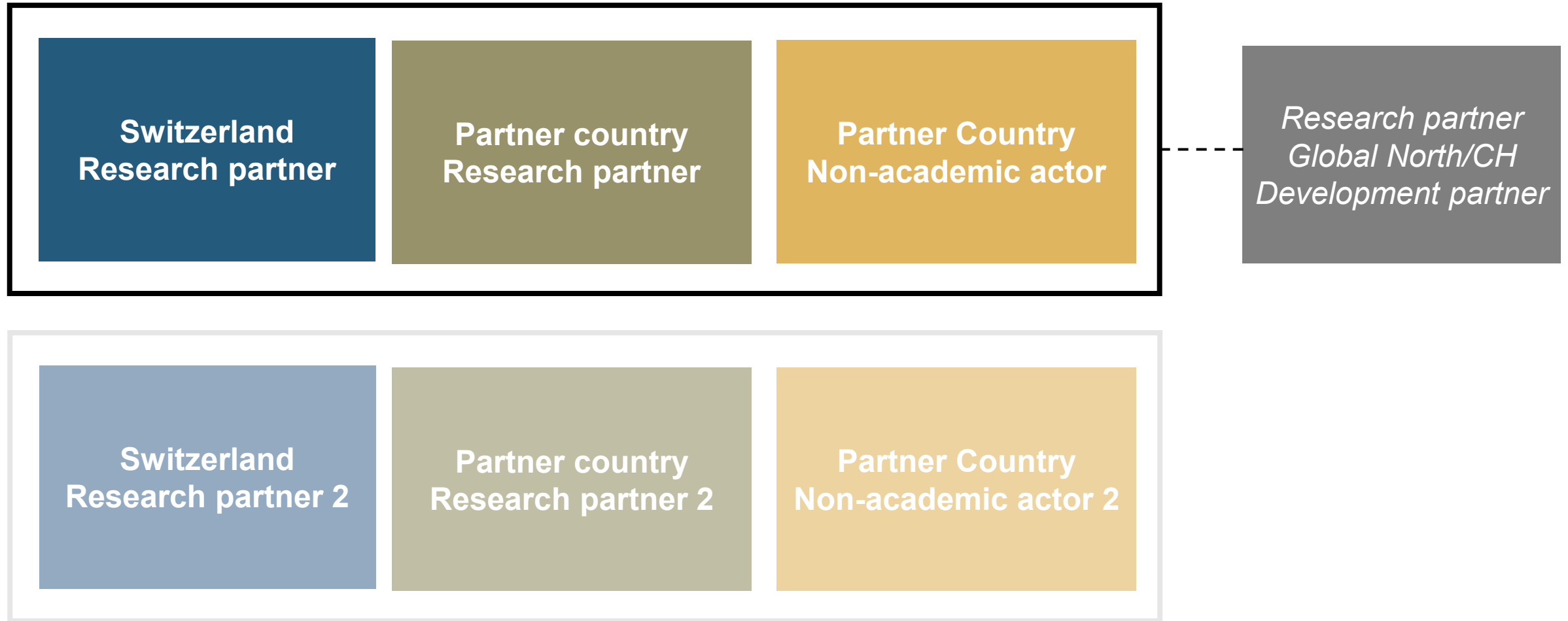


# SOR4D: thematic focus

- **Human development:** Improve lives by ensuring access to basic services, safe migration, and resilient health systems for vulnerable populations.
- **Sustainable economic development:** Foster decent jobs and inclusive growth through strong SMEs, efficient institutions, and integration into the global economy.
- **Climate and environment:** Promote climate resilience, biodiversity conservation, and sustainable resource use through innovation and green finance.
- **Peace and governance:** Advance peace, democracy, and human rights through inclusive governance, civic engagement, and rule of law.

# Eligible countries

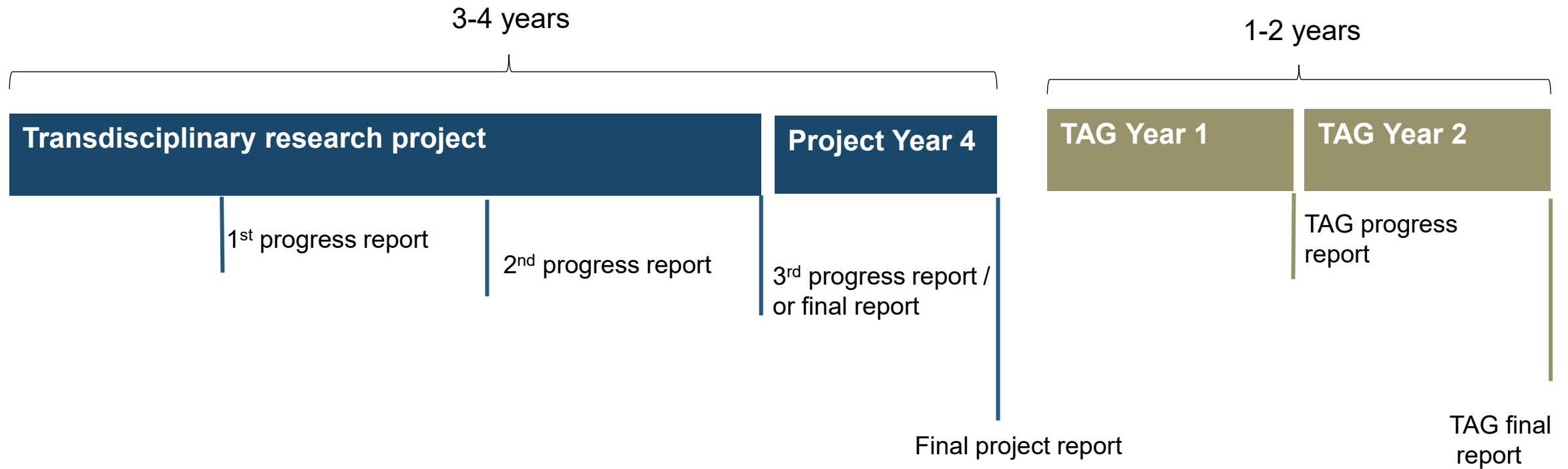
- **OECD DAC List:** focus on categories Least Developed Countries, Low Income Countries and Lower Middle-Income Countries.

# SOR4D: programme budget

Research funds: Project budgets, Transformation Accelerating Grants	CHF 20.06 million
Programme activities & monitoring: Communication (Events, publications); Community (workshops, knowledge transfer)	CHF 1.13 million
Management costs:	CHF 1.21 million
<b>Expected number of projects to be funded:</b>	<b>~ 20 projects</b>

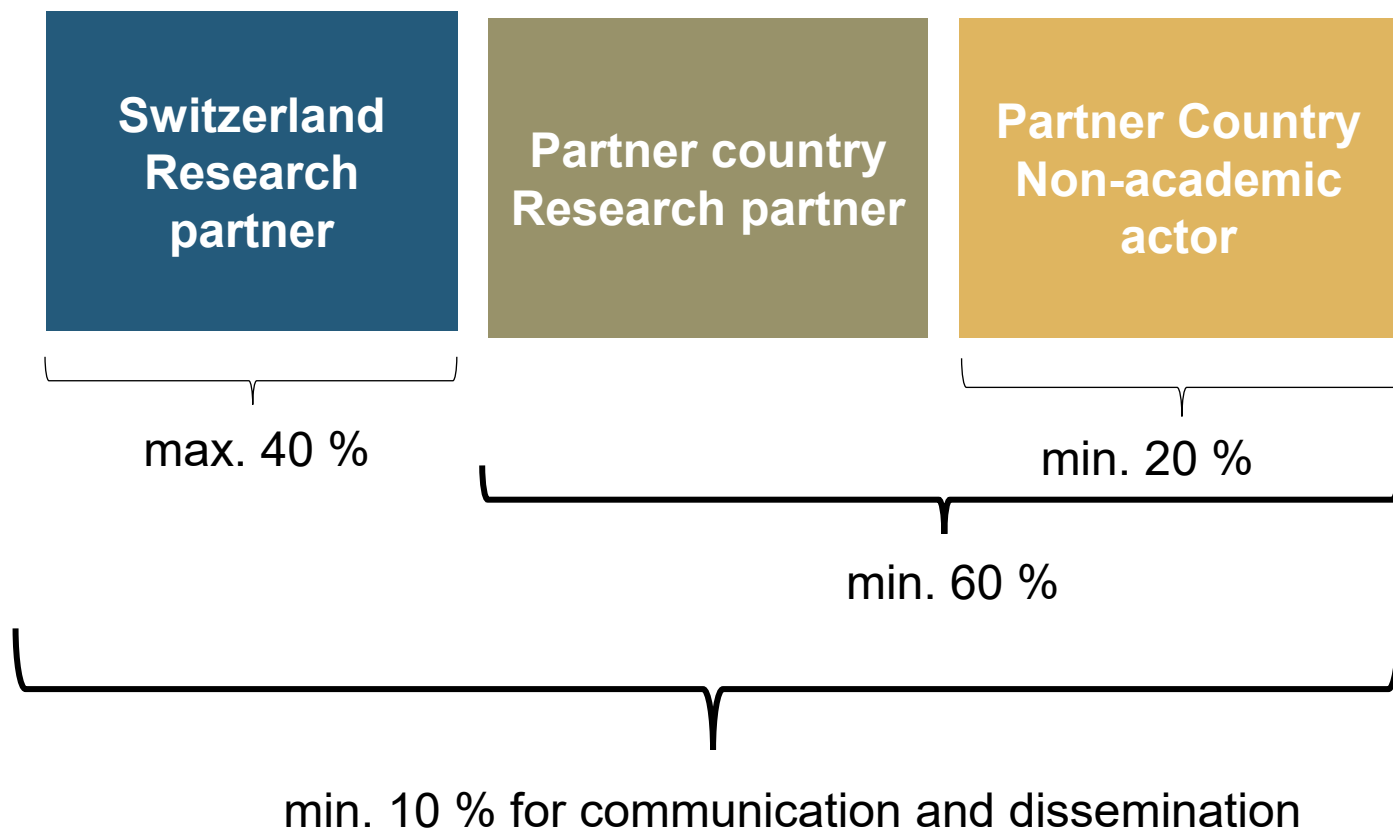
# SOR4D project funding: eligible costs



- Salaries:
  - PhD students, post-docs, project coordinators and other employees working on the project
  - Co-applicants from ODA recipient countries
- Communication and dissemination activities (e.g. workshops, conferences, video, trainings)
- Research/project funds: consumables, travel costs (compulsory emissions offsetting), room and board costs, field expenses
- Material costs: Equipment of enduring value (only eligible for partner countries)

# Financial conditions

SOR4D global project budget (~ 750'000 – 1'000'000 CHF)

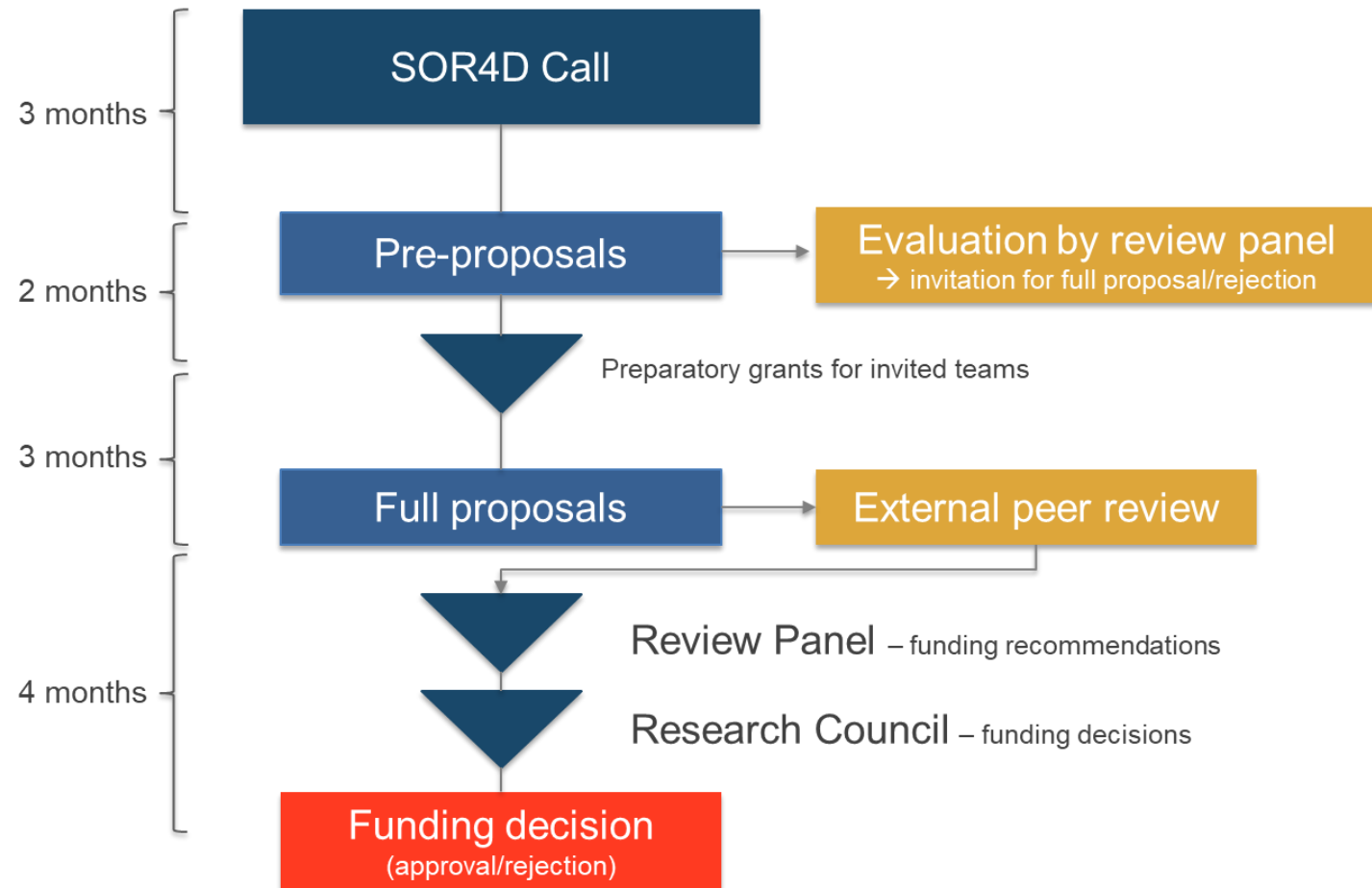


1. At least 60% must be spent in the least developed, low income or lower middle income partner country/countries
2. At least 20% of the total project budget must be allocated to the non-academic actor(s)
3. At least 10% for communication and dissemination

# Evaluation and funding recommendations

- Pre-proposals are evaluated by the Review Panel.
- Full proposals are reviewed by international peer experts. Based on these reviews and their own evaluation, the Review Panel will award marks.

The range of awardable marks according to the Unified Evaluation Procedure of the SNSF ranges from 1 (low quality) to 9 (high quality).





# Evaluation process and criteria

1. Relevance, originality and topicality of the project in addressing the programme objectives; in particular, research should be need-based;
2. Scientific quality, suitable methods;
3. The research project generates innovative solutions and new knowledge for impact, systemic change and scaling;
4. Qualifications and complementary expertise of consortium members, adequate distribution of tasks and shared responsibility, partnership approach and involvement of relevant stake-holders in all project stages;
5. Proposal demonstrates gender sensitivity (including gender balance in the project team), intersectionality and social inclusion and how these will be ensured throughout the project.
6. *Only for Full Proposals*: Proposal has an explicit and realistic theory of change, a clear Logical Framework contributing to the programme objectives, and a scale up strategy

Invitation for full proposals	September 2026
<b>Submission of full proposals</b>	<b>18 January 2027, 17.00 CET</b>
Evaluation of full proposals	Jan-March 2027
Funding decisions	April 2027
<b>Start of projects</b>	<b>May-Oct 2027</b>
